We have an enrollment of 404 students, with a senior class of 86 students.

We recognize that each student is an individual and therefore provide a series of learning experiences that equip young people to walk these unique paths. # **Grading/Ranking**

Our GPA is computed on a 100% scale. Beginning with grade nine, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. Grades less than 65 are not passing. Classes are on a semester basis – each student receives either a 0 or 1 credit per semester.

Students are ranked. GPAs are weighted for students who take honors classes by 1.05 and AP or College Now courses by 1.10.

## **Graduation Requirements**

Our graduation requirements meet or exceed the NYS requirements of **44 credits** and receive a 65 or higher on **5 Regents exams** (ELA, Math, Science, Global and US History) for a Regents Diploma **and 9 Regents exams** (ELA, Global, US History, Algebra, Geometry, Algebra II, Living Environment, Chemistry, NYC World Languages) for and Advanced Regents Diploma. A minimum of 44 credits is required for graduation.
